- This initial invitation for curriculum contributions will be sent out a minimum of 6 weeks prior to the commencement of the school year and requests will be sent out no more than once per term.
- All students have access to the standard curriculum
- Any record of payment or contributions by parents and guardians will be kept confidential and a receipt provided, on request.

### **Refunds**

Mallacoota P-12 College will consider requests for partial or full refunds of payments made by parents on a case-by-case basis taking into account the individual circumstances. Generally we will not be able to refund payments made for items purchased or costs that have already been paid where those funds have already been transferred to a third party. For example, camp costs when a child becomes unwell and cannot attend in circumstances where the payment has already been made or committed to a third party and no refund is available to the school. Where possible, we will make this clear to parents at the time of payment. An alternative option of retaining the payment on the family account for other charges will also be offered to parents.

1. To order your school calculator go to [www.schoolcalcs.com.au](http://www.schoolcalcs.com.au)
2. Enter the school portal code of mpc
3. Select your required calculator bundle, enter your student's details and delivery address and pay by VISA or MasterCard.
4. Place your order by 15<sup>th</sup> January 2023 and then collect your order from the College first week of Term 1 2023.
5. Or place your order by 5<sup>th</sup> February 2023 and collect from the College after 15<sup>th</sup> February 2023.
6. Orders placed after this date will be delivered to your home address for a fee of \$12.

# PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

## ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



### FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



### PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

#### Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

#### Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

#### Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



### FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



### SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
